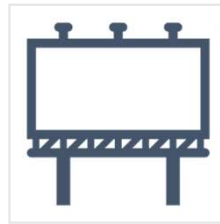

Principals Report Enrollment Update

Enrollment is at 314 students, up 9% over last year, 2nd fastest growing school in the diocese.

Principals Report Academic Update



Current State:

- We are in a great position as far as enrollment is concerned. We are up 9% over last year, and projecting to increase.
- Next Generation coaches are in the school. They are meeting with teachers, making pacing calendars, doing observations, and rearranging things to be more “teachable.” There is ongoing communication between coaches, teachers and myself to push ourselves academically.
- Partnered with CYO to bring in JiuJitsu (big response). Also partnering to bring Lacrosse into the Physical Education classes.
- Received a grant from the Diocese to open a Robotics program. I am still working on the details of finding a person and figuring out how this will best work into our school.
- Working to get our lunch program going. This is taking longer than expected because vendors were harder to find than we initially thought, but it looks like we are close to launching.

Principals Report

Curriculum and Academic Programs



- Switch from Go Math to Go Math 2 to keep up with the switch to Next Gen standards.
- Streamlined all science and Social Studies textbooks to Saavas for continuity.
- Standardized all test scores – we were on par with the city, but we are hoping to do better this year.
- Last year as PBT, using this year to transition to CBT.
- Incorporating more tech into classrooms in preparation for the transition to CBT.
- Getting more students into Title 1.

Finance Update

- The Academy's financial status: Stable, but with little cushion
- No debt, but small endowment (reserves)
- Tuition increases simply cover operating expenses
- Try extremely hard to minimize increases
- Need to be financially sustainable long-term
- Unexpected expenses have come from dwindling reserves



Finance Update

Fees, Explained



- New Registration: \$275 one child/\$125 each additional child
- Re-Registration: \$200 one child/\$125 each additional child
- Family Technology Fee: \$300
- School Family Fee: \$200 (meant to reduce burden on multi-child families)
- Lunch Program Fee: \$225 one child/\$275 two children/\$350 three children
- Fundraising Fee* \$225 (\$100 Fall Raffle per family/\$60 Annual Candy Sale per student/\$65 Annual Walkathon per student)
- TOTAL: \$925 for re-registrants, excluding fundraising

Finance Update

Available Discounts/Bonuses



- One-pay tuition: \$300 discount
- Two-pay tuition: \$150 discount
- Referral bonus: \$250 per new family referred (as tuition credit, provided that new student attends through year)

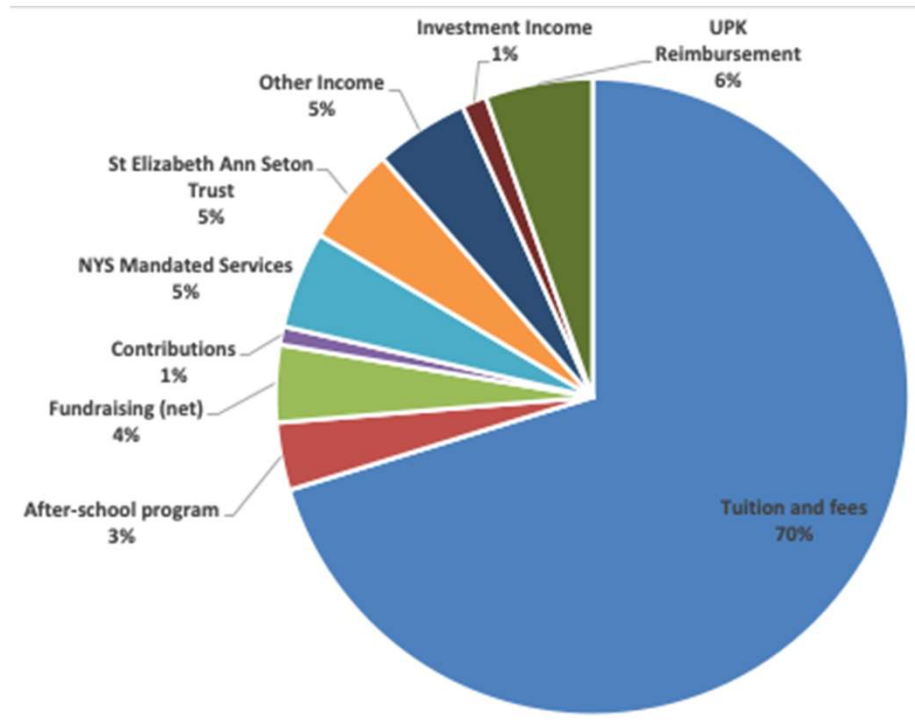

Academy Security Update

The Academy completed two independent reviews of our current academy safety methods

- One by a Homeland Security Protective Security Advisor (PSA) and a second by an independent security advisory firm
- The outside perimeter of the school, the interior and the front door (people coming and going) were observed for over a period of 3 hours
- The objective was to have an outside security service provide to us a baseline of our current safety methods and identify areas of improvement.

Academy Security Update

Security Assessment at First Entry (SAFE) Findings



The following positive and commendable operations-related and security practices were observed in place

Category	Commendable Action
Facility Information	Active shooter lockdown drills 4 times a year. Additionally, there is an intercom system, email and text notification system to get information out quickly
First Preventers – Responders	The academy is in Contact with the local NYPD Precinct and the assigned NCO
Information Sharing	All teachers and the principal in the school are assigned radios to quickly share information
Security Management	Command center created where staff can view security cameras and review previous incidents up to 30 days prior.
Perimeter Security	Several years ago, the academy replaced the front doors with two steel doors



Academy Security Update **Improvement Opportunities**

Security Assessment at First Entry (SAFE) Opportunities to Improve

The main entrance of the Academy on 46th street is a heavily trafficked area with a large vestibule.

- Currently there are two double exterior doors followed by a second set of double interior doors; both secured by a buzzer release.
- With this setup, a visitor is allowed into the school lobby before the front desk attendant can make visual contact and determine their intent.
- The visitor or intruder has an unobstructed path to the interior hallways with direct access to the classrooms

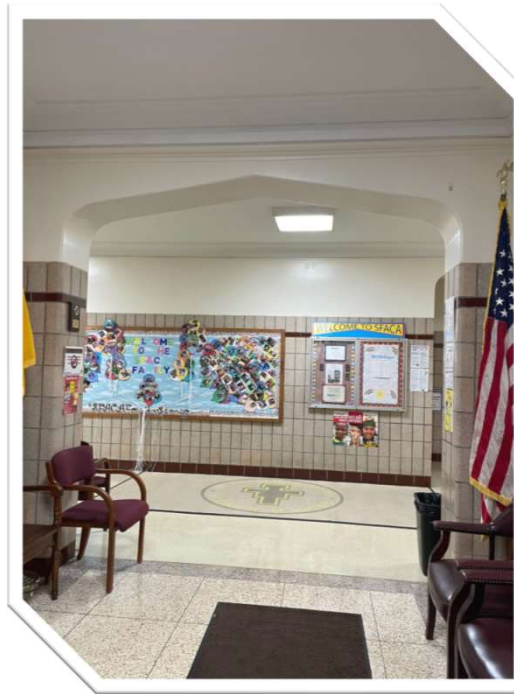
Academy Security Update

Door Hardening



To secure the interior hallways the board approved the installation of two sets of aluminum doors

The first set will be installed at the top of the stairs in the vestibule archway of the top landing.



Academy Security Update

Door Hardening

The second set of doors will be behind the first set of exterior doors **replacing** the wooden doors.





Academy Security Update

Controlling Academy Access

Reconfigure the main entrance design to secure the interior hallway

- Install two sets of new double doors, camera display, buzzer release and intercom
- Maintain visible signage on all academy doors directing visitors to the main entrance door.
- Funnel all visitors through the lobby desk, once signed in they will be approved for access and escorted into the school.
- Implement a visitor sign-in, sign-out, and chaperon procedure.



Academy Security Update

Secondary Classroom Door Locks

To secure the classrooms during a lock down event the board approved installing an additional lock on the classroom doors

- The current locks are not sufficient and often do not work properly
- The additional lock will be operable from both inside and outside the classroom; FDNY approved
- Enabling teachers to quickly secure the classroom during a lock down event



Academy Security Update

How will we fund the improvements

The academy will be **reimbursed** through the Nonpublic School Safety Equipment (NPSE) Grant

The procurement and installation of the 2 double doors and additional locks is estimated to cost \$44,600

- USMC Locksmith is the awarded vendor
- Installation will take place in phases starting January 2024, barring no unforeseen circumstances.
- All work will happen after academy hours.
